Maersk, for example, uses real-time data from integrated port systems to dynamically adjust vessel schedules, reroute cargo, and pre-allocate terminal space—reducing idle time and fuel costs. Smaller carriers, however, face disproportionate compliance burdens. The complexity of navigating diverse national systems—each with unique data formats, security protocols, and verification thresholds—creates a high barrier to entry. The International Chamber of Shipping estimates that digital compliance costs now consume 12–18% of operational budgets for mid-sized shipping operators, a strain that disproportionately affects independent firms. Expert perspectives underscore this duality. Dr. Anika Mehta, a maritime policy scholar at the

University of Malmö, argues that “online port entry is not neutral technology—it reflects the power structures of global trade.
