Crews from the Philippines, India, and Indonesia, often working months away from home, endure hazardous conditions amid growing scrutiny over labor rights. Proulx highlights the IMO 2020 sulfur cap, a landmark regulation mandating cleaner fuels that forced a \$30 billion industry-wide shift, disrupting supply chains and accelerating innovation in LNG and scrubber technology. Yet compliance disparities persist, with developing nations often lagging in enforcement, creating a two-tier system that mirrors global inequities. The environmental footprint of shipping, once an afterthought, is now central to Proulx's analysis. The industry contributes 3% of global CO₂ emissions—more than Germany's total—but its emissions are growing faster than any other transport sector. Proulx details the IMO's 2050 target to halve emissions, and the race toward alternative fuels: green hydrogen, ammonia, and biofuels. Yet technical hurdles remain—energy density, infrastructure, cost—while geopolitical tensions complicate cooperation. The Baltic and North Seas, once relatively clean, now face pressure from LNG bunkering and offshore wind development, raising questions about maritime spatial planning. Expert perspectives, woven throughout her work, reflect a divided field.

Economists like Jabbes of the Baltic Exchange warn of overinvestment and cyclical downturns, while climate scientists at the International Council on Clean Transportation caution that current decarbonization pathways are insufficient. Maritime lawyers, such as those at DLA Piper, caution against regulatory fragmentation as nations pursue unilateral green policies. Proulx captures this tension with nuance, showing how innovation coexists with inertia: blockchain is being tested for emissions tracking, AI optimizes route efficiency, yet fleet renewal lags due to high capital costs and market uncertainty. Controversies punctuate the narrative. The 2021 Osaka Anti-Corruption Agreement, designed to combat bribes in shipping, exposed systemic graft in ports from Lagos to Rotterdam. Proulx investigates how opaque flag states—often based in tax havens—enable substandard vessel operations, with flags of convenience allowing operators to evade safety and environmental regulations. The “ghost fleet” of dead ships, moored in Asia and awaiting profitable re-deployment, symbolizes both overcapacity and the moral hazard of delayed retirement. Risks are omnipresent. Geopolitical flashpoints—Houthi attacks in the Red Sea, North Korean sanctions evasion, cyberattacks on port infrastructure—threaten continuity. Proulx details how the 2023 cyber intrusion into a major terminal operator disrupted operations across multiple continents, a wake-up call for cyber resilience. Climate change intensifies physical risks: rising sea levels threaten low-lying ports like Bangkok and Miami; stronger storms damage terminals; shifting ice patterns open new Arctic routes but bring uncharted dangers. The Arctic shipping corridor, once frozen, now offers shorter passages between Europe and Asia, but comes with sovereignty disputes and lack of search-and-rescue capacity. Globally, comparisons reveal divergent trajectories. China’s state-backed shipping dominance—via CMA CGM and state-owned fleets—contrasts with Europe’s fragmented, unionized model and the U.S.’s reliance on foreign carriers.

Developing nations struggle to modernize, caught between the need for trade integration and insufficient infrastructure. Proulx notes how Africa's maritime potential remains stifled by piracy, outdated regulations, and limited investment, despite a coastline spanning 38,000 km and rich in natural resources. Long-term implications are staggering. Shipping's role in reshaping urbanization is profound: port cities like Shanghai, Singapore, and Rotterdam have grown into global hubs, driving economic transformation and inequality. The rise of mega-ships has concentrated traffic, favoring large ports and marginalizing smaller ones, altering regional development. Meanwhile, automation looms on the horizon—autonomous vessels, AI-driven logistics—promising efficiency but threatening millions of seafaring jobs. Proulx questions whether technological progress will deepen divides or create new forms of inclusion, particularly for developing nations. Forward-looking, Proulx emphasizes the imperative for systemic reform: stronger international cooperation, transparent governance, and equitable access to green innovation. She highlights emerging initiatives like the Global Maritime Decarbonization Framework and the push for digitalized, interoperable port systems. Yet she remains skeptical of voluntary measures, urging binding agreements with enforcement mechanisms. The shipping news, as she reveals, is not a passive reflection of events—it is an active force shaping policy, trade, and the planet's future. In the quiet of a watchtower or a dimly lit office, Proulx's reporting invites us to see the unseen: the invisible hands guiding the world's goods, the silent struggles beneath the waves, and the fragile balance between connection and fragility. Shipping is not just about moving cargo—it is about moving civilizations. And in that movement lies both the promise of progress and the weight of responsibility.
