According to a 2023 report by the American Society of News Editors, local newsrooms have shrunk by nearly 30% since 2008, yet audiences still rate local journalism as more credible than national outlets. This credibility gap has fueled demand for regional voices, particularly in communities undergoing rapid change. For Wilmington, where port expansion and demographic shifts are reshaping the city, this trust is not incidental—it's foundational. Dr. Elena Marquez, co-author of the Duke Media Resilience Project, adds a critical geopolitical dimension: 'Wilmington's media ecosystem mirrors a national paradox. lines of climate vulnerability and global trade—means its news agenda has outsized relevance.
