Subsequent revisions incorporated indigenous voices, Black intellectual traditions, and women’s suffrage leaders, transforming the narrative from one of elite male actors to a broader, contested struggle for inclusion. The geopolitical implications of this pedagogy extend beyond

classrooms. In an era of rising authoritarianism and historical revisionism, the “17” activity functions as a bulwark against historical amnesia. There is also the danger of "analysis paralysis"—where cognitive depth overshadows emotional engagement, particularly among students already alienated from school.
