From an expert perspective, the manual is both a triumph of professionalization and a site of ongoing debate. Dental educators and frontline administrators praise its rigor: it codifies tacit knowledge, reduces onboarding variability, and empowers receptionists—often overlooked in clinical hierarchies—to become active agents of care. Dr. Amina El-Sayed, a public health specialist
