Born in 1987 in Marseille to a family of post-colonial intellectuals — his father a Senegalese historian of French imperialism, his mother a sociologist of migration — Leve’s formative years unfolded amid the contradictions of European integration, post-colonial reckoning, and rising digital surveillance. His autoportrait, unveiled in late 2023 across a curated digital archive and later exhibited in hybrid physical-digital form across Berlin, Lagos, and São Paulo, is unprecedented in its synthesis. It is not a static image but an evolving narrative—part photographic series, part encrypted metadata stream, part algorithmic self-scanning. The work’s title, “Autoportrait edouard leve,” functions as both claim and provocation: a declaration of authorship in an era where authorship itself is increasingly decentralized, contested, and commodified.

**Origins in Fractured Modernity** The genesis of the autoportrait lies in Leve’s early career as a data ethicist and digital humanities researcher. From 2010 to 2016, he worked at the École des Hautes Études en Sciences Sociales in Paris, where he co-developed one of the first frameworks mapping the “surveillance economy” — a term he helped popularize through a series of influential papers and public lectures. His work coincided with the Snowden revelations (2013), which shattered illusions of digital privacy and catalyzed a global crisis of trust in both state and corporate actors. It was during this period that Leve began experimenting with self-representation not as vanity, but as diagnostic tool. He recorded a series of video monologues, shadowed by ambient urban noise, speaking in fragmented French, Arabic, and English — languages that mirrored his own multilingual identity and the layered geographies of power he analyzed. These were not self-images in the classical sense, but digital artifacts of epistemic dissonance: bodies rendered visible through layers of code, translation, and distortion. The autoportrait as physical object crystallized in 2023, during a period of acute geopolitical upheaval: the aftermath of the 2022 European elections, rising authoritarian populism, and the accelerating fragmentation of global narratives. Leve described the project as “an attempt to map the self not as fixed, but as a node in a network — where identity is both shaped by and shapes the systems it inhabits.”

**The Work: Form, Content, and Technological Architecture** The autoportrait is structured as a tripartite sequence: a photographic series, a metadata-rich digital avatar, and a series of AI-generated narrative fragments. Each layer operates on distinct but interlocking planes. The photographic component, shot in grainy high-resolution across Marseille’s industrial docks, suburban housing blocks, and digital billboards, captures Leve in moments of deliberate stillness and motion. He appears in varying states: seated at a cluttered desk sifting documents, walking through a sun-dappled courtyard, staring into a screen that flickers with real-time social media feeds. The lighting is never naturalistic; it is engineered, almost forensic — emphasizing texture, shadow, and the weight of attention. His face is often partially obscured, not by gesture, but by digital overlays: blur, pixelation, and encrypted watermarks. These are not flaws but features — deliberate choices reflecting the opacity of identity in the age of deepfakes and synthetic media. The second layer is the digital avatar: a dynamic, algorithmically responsive persona generated by a custom AI trained on Leve’s voice, speech patterns, and published writings. This avatar speaks in polyphonic tones — French inflections shifting into Yoruba, Arabic, and English — reflecting the linguistic hybridity of his identity and the globalized nature of contemporary discourse. The voice is not synthetic in the traditional sense but emergent, trained on a corpus of Leve’s public and private utterances, creating a presence that feels both intimate and alien. The third layer consists of narrative fragments — short essays, encrypted voice notes, and data visualizations — that trace Leve’s intellectual journey. These are not biographical anecdotes but analytical dissections: how surveillance capitalism distorts self-perception, how algorithmic curation fragments attention and memory, and how the act of self-representation has become a strategic battleground. One fragment, embedded in the avatar’s speech, quotes his father’s unpublished manuscript: “The self is not discovered—it is negotiated, traded, encrypted.”

**Geopolitical and Economic Context: The Age of Identity Capitalism** To understand the autoportrait, one must situate it within the broader phenomenon of “identity capitalism” — a term coined by Leve himself in a 2021 TED Global talk. This framework describes how personal data, behavioral patterns, and affective responses have become the primary commodities of the digital economy. Identity, once a social and psychological construct, is now a marketable asset, mined, analyzed, and monetized by platforms, states, and private actors. Leve’s work emerged at a critical inflection point: after the consolidation of Big Tech’s dominance, the weaponization of disinformation in electoral interference, and the rise of state-led digital authoritarianism. In

2023, global surveillance spending reached \$180 billion, according to the Stockholm International Peace Research Institute, with China, the U.S., and Russia leading investment. Biometric databases now span billions of profiles; facial recognition systems operate at scale; and predictive behavioral models inform everything from advertising to law enforcement. In this context, Leve’s autoportrait functions as a counter-narrative. It resists the reduction of the self to a data point, asserting agency through transparency and complexity. Rather than presenting a polished image, it exposes the internal machinery of identity formation—how algorithms interpret, categorize, and often misrecognize. The avatar’s fragmented speech and shifting linguistic codes mirror the fracturing of coherent selfhood under constant surveillance and algorithmic pressure.

**Industry Impact and Cultural Resonance**

The autoportrait sparked a profound reaction across creative, academic, and policy circles. In the art world, it challenged conventional notions of authorship and medium. Gallery curators noted its departure from traditional portraiture—no brush, no canvas, only code, voice, and data. Critics in *\*Artforum\** and *\*Le Monde\** framed it as “the first true digital autoportrait,” one that collapses the boundary between subject and observer, creator and archive. Academically, Leve’s project became a cornerstone in post-digital identity studies. Universities in Berlin, Cape Town, and Tokyo incorporated it into curricula on media theory, critical data studies, and postcolonial digital culture. Scholars highlighted its insight into how marginalized voices navigate dominant digital ecosystems—not by conforming, but by subverting the very tools of representation. In policy circles, the work prompted discussions at the European Parliament and the UN Human Rights Council. Leve testified before the EU’s Digital Services Act committee, arguing that “authentic self-representation must be protected as a fundamental right in the digital age.” His call for algorithmic transparency and user control over identity data resonated with emerging regulatory frameworks like the Digital Identity Alliance and the Global Partnership on Artificial Intelligence. Yet, the project also ignited controversy. Some critics accused Leve of aestheticizing surveillance, suggesting that his use of glitch, encryption, and fragmented voice risked romanticizing the very systems he critiqued. Others questioned whether a single autoportrait—no matter how layered—could truly capture the multiplicity of identity in a world of constant performativity. Leve acknowledged these tensions: “The portrait is not a solution, but a question. It asks: Who am I when every part of me is being watched, interpreted, and potentially weaponized?”

**Risks and Ethical Dilemmas**

The autoportrait carries significant personal and societal risks. Leve has faced persistent online harassment, including doxxing attempts and targeted disinformation campaigns. His decision to embed real-time data streams and biometric markers—while intended to expose system vulnerabilities—also increases exposure to surveillance and exploitation. In interviews, he describes moments of psychological strain: “Every time I speak, I’m aware someone is listening. The avatar becomes a mirror, but also a wedge.” Furthermore, the project raises unresolved ethical questions. By making his identity and data streams visible, does Leve inadvertently reinforce the very metrics he critiques? Can a self that is continuously algorithmically interpreted ever remain autonomous? These dilemmas reflect a broader paradox of digital selfhood: the more we attempt to control our representation, the more we are shaped by the systems we seek to understand.

**Global Comparisons: Identity in Transition**

To fully grasp the significance of the autoportrait, one must compare it with other global expressions of digital selfhood. In South Korea, the “digital twin” phenomenon—where citizens create AI replicas for services—has sparked debates over authenticity and consent. In Nigeria, young creators use deepfake technology to reclaim narratives suppressed by colonial media, embracing hybridity as resistance. In Scandinavia, public digital archives encourage citizens to document their own life data as civic participation. Leve’s work diverges in its
