Finally, **Samavahana** (Energetic Release) integrates the experience into daily life, teaching practitioners to embody insight without clinging, ensuring the kriya’s benefits endure beyond formal practice. This structured progression reflects a profound understanding of neuroplasticity long before modern science named it. Controversies and Risks: Between Enlightenment and Exploitation
