When it exposed a \$120 million infrastructure tender in Mali awarded without competitive bidding, the fallout included diplomatic

friction and accusations of Western bias. Similarly, in Southeast Asia, ICIVICS' exposure of irregular defense spending in the Philippines triggered parliamentary investigations but also prompted a national security review that realigned procurement pathways toward domestic suppliers. This illustrates a paradox: while ICIVICS champions transparency, its interventions often strengthen state capacity—sometimes reinforcing the very institutions it scrutinizes.
