In contrast, post-colonial states often inherited fragmented or coercive disarmament policies. In India, the Arms Act of 1959 reflected a legacy of British colonial control and post-independence

concerns over internal security. Legal compulsion served dual purposes: state monopoly on force and symbolic assertion of sovereignty. Yet enforcement varied widely across regions, revealing how legal mandates often masked structural disparities in policing and power.

Geopolitical and Economic Drivers: The Weaponization of Law

The logic of legally mandating arms bears arms—it is not a passive obligation but an active instrument of statecraft shaped by geopolitical imperatives and economic interests. In nations facing persistent external threat—Israel, South Korea, or Japan—mandatory or near-universal arm-bearing is framed as a civic duty essential to national survival. Israel’s *Conscription Law* and *Armed Forces Law* mandate service for citizens and permanent residents alike, fused with a legal right to possess arms under strict state supervision. This integration of bearing arms into national identity serves both deterrence and deterrence-by-appearance: a population armed reflects a state capable of defending its sovereignty. Economically, the arms industry has profoundly influenced the legal architecture around mandatory bearing. In the United States, the \$80 billion firearms industry—backed by powerful lobbying networks—has shaped legislation not through overt coercion, but via a feedback loop of political influence, campaign financing, and public discourse. Gun manufacturers and dealers have historically framed mandatory bearing as a constitutional right, leveraging the Second Amendment to resist disarmament efforts. This has led to a paradox: while demand for civilian arms rises in tandem with legal mandates, the industry profits from a system that combines law, culture, and consumerism. In contrast, European nations like Germany and Sweden maintain stricter controls, where mandatory bearing is rare and heavily conditional. Germany’s *Weapons Act* requires individual permits for nearly all firearms, with rigorous psychological and technical assessments—mirroring a post-WWII emphasis on restraint and public safety. The economic rationale here is less about industrial scale and more about social cohesion; arms ownership is treated as a privilege, not a right, reducing the state’s obligation to provide broad access. Emerging economies face a different calculus. In Nigeria, rapid urban violence and weak state presence have led to informal proliferation, with legal arms regulations often ignored or selectively enforced. Here, mandatory bearing is less a legal norm than a de facto reality—citizens arm themselves not by law, but out of necessity. The state’s inability to enforce disarmament reveals a fundamental failure of governance, where legal compulsion loses meaning without institutional capacity.

Expert Perspectives: Law, Liberty, and the Calculus of Risk

Legal scholars have long debated the permissibility and wisdom of mandatory arm-bearing. Constitutional theorist Saul Cornell argues that the Second Amendment protects individual rights,

not collective obligations—thus, no law can legally compel bearing, only regulate possession. Yet scholars like Richard Epstein counter that self-defense is a natural right, and a state that fails to protect its citizens implicitly violates its duty by restricting access to defensive tools. Psychologists and criminologists offer divergent views on risk. Dr. David Hemenway of Harvard’s Injury Control Research Center asserts that universal arm ownership increases homicide and suicide rates by normalizing lethal force—citing data from states with high civilian gun ownership and elevated firearm suicide. Conversely, researchers such as John Lott Jr. argue that concealed carry deters crime and empowers citizens, particularly vulnerable groups. These competing narratives feed into policy: in the U.S., Lott’s **More Guns, Less Crime (1998) catalyzed a wave of permit-less carry laws, while Hemenway’s epidemiological work underpins stringent state-level restrictions. Military strategists emphasize deterrence through readiness. General James Mattis, former U.S. Secretary of Defense, framed armed citizens as a force multiplier—nations with broad civilian readiness reduce reliance on standing armies and enhance domestic resilience. Yet critics warn of escalation: when every citizen bears arms, the threshold for violence lowers, and civil conflict becomes more likely. The 2021 U.S. Capitol attack, where armed participants invoked self-defense and constitutional rights, exemplifies how legally sanctioned arm-bearing can blur into political insurrection.**

Controversies and Civil Liberties: The Erosion of Trust

The mandate to bear arms, even when legally enforced, often collides with civil liberties. In countries with robust surveillance and policing, mandatory arm-bearing may reinforce state control; in fragile democracies, it can deepen distrust. In Brazil, where urban gangs dominate street life, legal disarmament campaigns have been criticized as performative—policing favors elite neighborhoods, while marginalized communities face disproportionate force for illegal weapons. Here, mandatory bearing becomes a tool of symbolic authority, reinforcing inequality rather than justice. Legal scholars such as Cass Sunstein caution that mandatory arms laws, when poorly designed, trigger reactive resistance. When citizens perceive such laws as

oppressive or selectively enforced, compliance declines—and defiance grows. This dynamic is evident in Germany’s strict licensing regime: while high compliance exists, it stems not from coercion but from public trust in institutions. In contrast, in nations with weak rule of law, mandatory bearing can empower corrupt elites to weaponize registration systems, turning legal compliance into surveillance. The First Amendment context in the U.S. adds another layer: gun ownership is legally protected, but mandatory bearing—if imposed without consent—risks being interpreted as an unconstitutional encroachment on liberty. Yet the Supreme Court’s **District of Columbia v. Heller** (2008) decision affirmed an individual right to bear arms, creating a constitutional paradox: a right that, in theory, allows voluntary bearing, but in practice, courts have yet to recognize a mandatory obligation. This legal ambiguity fuels ongoing litigation, from permit requirements to concealed carry laws.

Industry Impact: From Arms Manufacturers to Civil Society

The firearms industry’s role in shaping legal mandates is both economic and political. In the U.S., companies like Glock, Smith & Wesson, and Bull Armory have grown
