Similarly, the Appalachian Mountains in the U.S. illustrate how industrial decline reshapes place identity, yet also catalyze grassroots movements for ecological restoration. Glencoe, like these regions, demonstrates that geography is not a fixed container but a contested arena where capital, ecology, and culture intersect. Its current transformation into a hub of experiential tourism reflects a global trend: the commodification of “authentic” rural landscapes, where geography becomes both asset and narrative. Expert analysis underscores Glencoe's evolving role. Dr. Alistair MacLeod, a geographer specializing in Scottish highland systems at the University of Edinburgh, observes: “Glencoe's significance lies in its liminality—neither fully integrated nor entirely marginal.
