Economically, the funding models and governance structures of education systems profoundly shape devotional practices. In privatized or faith-based school networks—particularly in the U.S. and India—devotions are often embedded as core program elements, funded through tuition, endowments, or religious organizations. In publicly funded systems, especially in fiscally strained regions, such practices are increasingly rare due to resource constraints and administrative prioritization of core academic instruction. The privatization trend, accelerating since the 1980s, has thus created a two-tier reality: elite institutions sustain robust, personalized devotional or spiritual programming, while under-resourced public schools often lack the bandwidth—both material and cultural—to maintain them. The rise of "spiritual but not religious" identities among youth, coupled with increasing mental health challenges, demands a reevaluation of how schools support emotional resilience. When devotions are poorly designed—dogmatic, exclusionary, or alienating—they can exacerbate anxiety rather than alleviate it. Conversely, evidence from Finland's holistic education model shows that when reflection is student-centered, dialogic, and grounded in empathy, it strengthens psychological safety and community bonds. Looking forward, the future of end-of-year devotions hinges on three key trajectories. First, increasing institutionalization of inclusive spiritual literacy—curricula that teach mindfulness, ethics, and intercultural understanding without privileging any tradition—may offer a sustainable alternative. Second, technology will continue to reshape delivery, but with growing scrutiny over algorithmic bias and emotional manipulation. Third, as global labor markets demand adaptability and emotional intelligence, schools may reclaim devotions not as indoctrination, but as intentional spaces for cultivating inner strength, ethical reasoning, and collective purpose. Experts like Dr. Kwame Osei, a comparative education scholar at the University of Cape Town, argue: 'The essence of meaningful

reflection isn't tied to religion or ritual—it's about creating moments where students and teachers feel seen, heard, and connected.
