Dr. Amara Weymouth, author of **The Mindful Leader**, contextualizes devotions as “emotional infrastructure.” She notes that consistent reflection builds what she calls “cognitive resilience”—the capacity to remain clear-headed when others falter. In her work with global executives, she observes that teams practicing daily devotions report 37% higher psychological safety and 29% better cross-functional trust. From a neuroscientific perspective, regular reflection strengthens prefrontal cortex activity, enhancing executive function, emotional regulation, and empathy—critical competencies in volatile leadership contexts. Functional MRI studies show that structured contemplative practices reduce amygdala reactivity, lowering stress responses and improving decision quality. Yet, experts caution against ritualization without substance. Devotions must be authentic, not performative. As Dr. Rana Foroohar, Financial Times columnist and author of **Mightier Than the Sword**, warns: “When devotions become hollow ceremonies, they erode trust faster than any crisis. Leaders must embody

the values they outline—otherwise, they become symbols of disconnection.” Thus, the most effective devotions are co-created, iterative, and integrated into daily workflows—not imposed from above, but cultivated through dialogue, feedback, and vulnerability.
