This resurgence reflects a broader shift: consumers increasingly seek provenance, durability, and ethical labor—values embodied in each carefully cut mortise and tenon. Yet the path is fraught with structural risks. Industrialization pressures drive deforestation, particularly in biodiverse regions like the Yucatán and the Andean highlands, where unregulated logging threatens both ecosystems and supply. Meanwhile, globalization exposes local artisans to competition from synthetic materials and automated production, undermining the economic viability of handcraft. A

2022 study by the Inter-American Development Bank warned that without institutional support—subsidized wood sourcing, apprenticeship programs, and intellectual property protections—*planos de sillas de madera* risk fading from functional reality into nostalgic artifact. From a geopolitical lens, *planos* reveal deeper tensions between cultural sovereignty and economic integration. Instead, community-led governance models, such as cooperatives that pool designs under shared stewardship, are emerging as more culturally coherent solutions. Globally, comparisons reveal divergent trajectories. In Japan, **kawa-ba** (wooden chair) traditions persist in minimalist design studios, blending Shinto reverence for natural materials with modern aesthetics. In Scandinavia, industrial design giants like IKEA have co-opted wooden chair motifs into mass-market collections, but without deep engagement with the cultural context—turning **planos** into aesthetic tropes rather than functional heritage. In contrast, South Africa's post-apartheid craft revival actively integrates indigenous chair-making into public education, framing wooden seating as part of national identity and economic empowerment.
