transcendence—values she believed under siege in an industrializing America. This early phase of acquisition was deeply shaped by the geopolitical currents of the late 19th century. The opening of global markets after the Suez Canal's completion (1869) had accelerated the movement of art across continents. European museums, buoyed by colonial wealth, were acquiring vast quantities of non-Western artifacts—often under dubious or coercive circumstances. The villa's architecture, designed by architect Guy Lowell in a Venetian Gothic style, was itself a statement. It rejected the sterile, museum-box model of the era, instead evoking a lived experience—rooms that invited contemplation, light that shifted like memory. This spatial logic mirrored her curatorial philosophy: art as a sensory and emotional journey, not a static display. By 1903, Gardner's collection had grown to over 500 works; she endowed the museum in her will, specifying that it remain “a place of pleasure and inspiration, free to all.” This vision was radical. Her model influenced later civic museums, from the Barnes Foundation to the Museum of Modern Art, which sought to balance preservation with public engagement.
