The Greek of Ephesians displays a blend of Hellenistic rhetorical style and Semitic cadence, indicating a bilingual intellectual milieu. Expert analysis featured in the study underscores Ephesus's role as a theological incubator. Critical scholars challenge the Pauline attribution, citing theological developments incompatible with Paul's known corpus—such as the doctrine of Ephesians 6's "slaves and masters" reciprocal obligations, which reflects post-1st-century socio-political conditions. Conversely, liberation theologians see in its "unity in diversity" a radical challenge to exclusionary systems, a message still vital in pluralistic societies. Global

comparisons illuminate Ephesus's enduring influence.
