A 2013 internal review, declassified in 2021, noted: ‘Students respond well to interactivity, but only when it serves narrative and purpose, not novelty.’ This feedback catalyzed a radical rethinking. By 2015, the third iteration—Box 3—introduced a layered architecture: physical “boxes” integrated with digital layers, each aligned to developmental stages. This required not just training in technology, but in emotional intelligence—understanding when to intervene, when to step back, and how to foster resilience

United States, China, and the European Union—created pressure to redefine education’s purpose.
