His message, "On the Holy Spirit," was not merely devotional; it was a theological intervention into a continent where spiritual healing was both a personal and political act, a claim of divine authority amid systemic disillusionment. This fusion of theology and media spectacle resonated with deeper cultural currents. In postcolonial societies where institutional trust is eroded, charismatic leaders like Hinn offer immediacy and agency. The Holy Spirit, as presented, becomes a counter-narrative to political corruption, economic precarity, and historical trauma. The broadcast's impact was immediate: within 72 hours, social media platforms exploded with footage, testimonials, and debates. Millions tuned in across 140 countries, with viewership peaking not just in Pentecostal strongholds like Nigeria and Kenya, but in diaspora communities from London to Toronto. Yet beneath the viral enthusiasm lay significant theological and ethical tensions. Critics within Pentecostal academia, such as Dr. Grace Wambua of the University of Nairobi, have questioned whether Hinn's emphasis on dramatic signs risks reducing the Spirit to a consumable event—what she terms "theologically shallow performativity." The absence of sustained theological depth,

reliance on subjective testimony, and the prioritization of emotional response over doctrinal coherence have drawn scrutiny. Moreover, the commercial scale of the event—complete with ticket sales, merchandise, and linked media rights—raises questions about the commodification of spiritual experience. From a media economics perspective, “On the Holy Spirit” exemplifies the transformation of religious broadcasting from niche ministry to global entertainment. His career, from Lebanese diaspora to global spiritual entrepreneur, illustrates how faith evolves when fused with the technologies and economies of the modern world. Yet, as with all religious entrepreneurs, his success invites scrutiny: is the Spirit truly at work, or is divine presence being harnessed for visibility and power? The answer, perhaps, lies in the lived experience of millions—devotees who see, hear, and believe.

Geopolitical and Economic Context: The Rise of Faith-Based Media in Africa and Beyond

Hinn’s organization, *On the Holy Spirit International*, operates with corporate precision: satellite broadcasting, digital streaming, merchandise sales, and partnerships with global

media platforms. This model mirrors secular entertainment conglomerates—revenue streams include ticket sales, licensing fees, and sponsorships from faith-aligned brands. In Nigeria alone, Pentecostal media networks generate over \$1 billion annually, driven by subscription models, online donations, and televised crusades. Hinn’s “On the Holy Spirit” event exemplifies this: broadcast via satellite and social media, it reached millions without physical venue constraints, maximizing monetization through digital engagement. Yet this commercialization raises questions about authenticity and access. Critics, including theologian Grace Wambua, argue that the emphasis on mass spectacle risks reducing spiritual encounters to consumable entertainment. The absence of rigorous theological oversight, combined with high production values, may prioritize emotional impact over doctrinal depth. Moreover, the reliance on digital platforms—while expanding reach—widens the gap between those with reliable internet access and marginalized communities, reinforcing inequalities within religious participation. Globally, Hinn’s influence mirrors broader trends: religious authority is increasingly decentralized, mediated through digital networks rather than institutional hierarchies. In South Korea, megachurches like Yoido Full Gospel Church use similar strategies—televised services, online giving, and global outreach—to build transnational followings. In Latin America, neo-Pentecostal leaders leverage social media to cultivate loyal communities, blurring sacred and commercial spheres. Hinn’s ministry thus sits at the vanguard of a global shift: faith as a media product, where spiritual capital is converted into economic and social power. Looking forward, the convergence of media technology and religious practice will deepen. Artificial intelligence, virtual reality, and algorithmic personalization are poised to redefine spiritual engagement. Hinn’s legacy, therefore, lies not only in his content but in his model: a faith-based enterprise that merges theology with spectacle, community with commerce, and tradition with innovation. Whether this model endures depends on its ability to balance outreach with accountability, spectacle with substance, and global reach with local relevance.

Expert Perspectives: Theological, Academic, and Ethical Critiques

The reception of Benny Hinn’s message, particularly through “On the Holy Spirit,” has elicited a spectrum of expert responses—from theological affirmation to rigorous critique. Within Pentecostal and charismatic circles, Hinn is often celebrated as a modern-day prophet of spiritual renewal.
