The origins of formal motor vehicle licensing in Afghanistan are not rooted in indigenous statecraft but in the colonial and post-colonial pressures of the 20th century. The earliest attempts at vehicle regulation emerged during the 1920s under Amanullah Khan’s brief modernization campaign, which sought to centralize governance and introduce Western-style infrastructure. However, comprehensive licensing systems did not take hold until the mid-20th century, shaped by Soviet influence during the 1950s and 1960s, when technical training and traffic management became tools of state consolidation. By the 1970s, the Afghanistan Motor Transport Organization (AMTO), established with Soviet technical support, began standardizing driver assessments—though these were largely confined to urban centers like Kabul and Kandahar, where modernization efforts were most concentrated. Following the Soviet withdrawal and the subsequent civil wars of the 1990s, the DMV system collapsed. The Taliban’s first regime (1996–2001) abolished civilian licensing institutions, deeming them remnants of foreign-backed governance. Looking ahead, the long-term implications hinge on institutional reform and cultural adaptation. The Taliban's return in 2021 has introduced new uncertainties. While there are no publicly announced changes to the test's mechanics, the reimposition of a centralized, ideologically aligned Ministry of Interior suggests potential shifts in criteria, language, and oversight. Whether the DMV test will evolve into a more inclusive, locally responsive institution—or revert to a tool of exclusion and control—depends on broader political stability, investment in civic infrastructure, and the state's willingness to engage with Afghanistan's diverse populations as equal participants, not passive subjects. Technological innovation offers both promise and peril. Pilot digital licensing platforms, tested in urban centers, could streamline processes and reduce fraud. Yet such systems risk deepening exclusion unless accompanied by robust literacy programs, multilingual support, and offline alternatives. The Dari language, with its rich idiomatic nuance and regional dialects, demands careful integration—beyond mere translation into Dari script, into contextual understanding that reflects local drivers' experiences. Economically, the DMV test remains a critical node in labor and mobility networks. As Afghanistan's informal economy persists and cross-border trade expands, verified driver credentials could facilitate greater integration into regional markets. Still, they laid the institutional groundwork for what would later become the national DMV test.

Although these systems aimed at professionalism, they remained largely urban-centric and accessible only to a small elite. Rural populations, accounting for over 70% of Afghanistan's people at the time, were excluded from formal licensing, reinforcing the urban-rural divide. The Dari language played a central role here—not just as a medium of instruction, but as a marker of administrative legitimacy in a society where oral tradition and local governance held deep cultural weight.

Collapse and Fragmentation Under Civil War (1990s)

The collapse of the central state during the Afghan Civil Wars (1992–1996) dismantled formal licensing institutions. With the fall of the Democratic Republic of Afghanistan and the rise of mujahideen factions, state infrastructure—including DMV offices—was abandoned, seized, or destroyed. The Taliban's first regime (1996–2001) further suppressed civilian institutions, dismissing formal licensing as a relic of foreign-backed governance. In this vacuum, informal transport networks flourished, governed by tribal codes and local warlords rather than state exams. The Dari language remained vital, but its use in official contexts vanished, replaced by ad-hoc, often arbitrary assessments of driving 'competence' based on loyalty or tribal affiliation. This period underscored the fragility of state-engineered bureaucracy in the absence of political stability.

Reconstruction and the Post-2001 DMV Revival

With the U.S.-led intervention and the reestablishment of the Afghan Ministry of Interior in the mid-2000s, the DMV reemerged as a cornerstone of state-building. The Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV), supported by USAID and international partners, launched nationwide licensing programs aimed at restoring legal mobility, reducing informal transport, and generating state revenue. Dari was adopted as the primary language for instruction and exams, reflecting both linguistic reality and efforts to build trust with non-Pashtun populations. Testing stations were established in major cities and gradually expanded into provincial centers, though coverage remained uneven. The test itself evolved: written Dari exams assessed rule knowledge, practical tests evaluated maneuvering and safety, and oral interviews tested comprehension under pressure. Yet even here, challenges persisted—corruption, understaffing, and logistical shortages hindered consistent implementation across provinces.

Geopolitical Context and International Influence

During the 2000s and early 2010s, international actors viewed standardized licensing as a tool for economic stabilization and job creation. These efforts aligned with global norms on identity verification and formal employment, seen as prerequisites for integration into regional trade and humanitarian aid networks. However, foreign involvement also sparked debates over sovereignty and cultural relevance. Critics argued that externally driven reforms risked imposing rigid, one-size-fits-all models ill-suited to Afghanistan's decentralized, culturally diverse reality. The Dari-language test, while practical, became a contested symbol—embodying both progress and external imposition.

Socioeconomic Implications and the Cost of Mobility

For most Afghans, obtaining a driver's license is not merely a technical milestone but a socioeconomic necessity. In rural areas, despite limited formal employment, driving enables access to distant markets, seasonal labor, and emergency services. For urban youth, especially in Kabul and Herat, a license opens pathways to informal transport jobs—motorbike taxis, delivery services—where official wages often depend on verified credentials. Yet the test's cost, both financial and temporal, creates significant barriers. Fees range from 10 to 50 afghanis, a substantial sum for subsistence families. Wait times, exacerbated by understaffed stations and seasonal demand, can stretch to weeks, deepening exclusion. In regions where literacy is low and Dari comprehension of formal instructions is uneven, the oral and written components compound disadvantage. Thus, the DMV test functions as both a gateway and a gatekeeper, reinforcing existing inequalities while claiming neutrality.

Reports of bribes for expedited processing, favoritism toward urban applicants, and falsified exam results highlight systemic weaknesses. In Taliban-controlled areas, informal assessments based on tribal ties or religious credentials sometimes replace formal exams, further eroding trust. The digital transition—introduced unevenly—has deepened divides: urban centers with reliable internet access benefit, while rural regions face delays or exclusion. Data privacy remains a concern: personal information collected during testing is often stored without secure systems, risking misuse. These vulnerabilities expose the DMV not just as a bureaucratic unit, but as a microcosm of broader governance failures—where accountability is weak, and power concentrated in fragmented, often unmonitored institutions.

This divergence underscores how administrative modernization is deeply shaped by political stability, linguistic unity, and institutional capacity.
