India, despite its democratic facade, faced internal threats that mirrored global trends: Islamist militancy, ethno-nationalist mobilization, and the porous nexus between local gangs and transnational networks. The D-Company, with links to Afghan opium trade and Middle Eastern financiers, exemplified this hybrid threat—operating with impunity across borders, exploiting India's federal weaknesses. The 1993 riots thus became a case study in how non-state actors could leverage urban chaos, exploiting state vacuums where federal oversight was thin and local institutions were compromised. Joshi's reporting underscored that the violence was not an anomaly, but a symptom of a deeper erosion: of rule of law, of inter-community trust, and of democratic resilience. Joshi’s narrative draws parallels with South Africa’s township violence in the 1990s—both born of apartheid or post-colonial neglect—but diverges in its urban, financial setting, underscoring how globalization intensifies localized trauma. The long-term implications reverberate to this day. The riots catalyzed reforms—most notably the formation of the Maharashtra Special Police Establishment (MSPE) and the strengthening of anti-terror financing mechanisms. Yet systemic weaknesses persist: communal vigilantism remains a specter, intelligence integration is still fragmented, and marginalized communities continue to bear the brunt of state neglect. Joshi’s work foreshadows a critical insight: true resilience requires not just security, but justice—truth commissions, reparations, and institutional accountability. Without these, cycles of violence repeat, as seen in later outbreaks in Gujarat (2002), Kashmir (2016), and beyond. Looking forward, the 1993 crisis offers a cautionary blueprint for 21st-century urban governance. As megacities worldwide grapple with rising inequality, climate-induced displacement, and digital radicalization, Mumbai’s near-collapse serves as a stress test. The imperative is clear: invest in inclusive development, not just surveillance; build inter-agency trust, rooted in transparency; and center marginalized voices in policy-making. Joshi’s reporting, raw and relentless, reminds us that behind every statistic is a human cost—one that demands not just remembrance, but reckoning. In the end, **Six Days in Bombay** is more than a chronicle of destruction. It is a mirror held to the soul of a city—and a nation—struggling to reconcile its pluralism with its vulnerabilities.
