If reimagined as a gateway to curiosity—incorporating local histories, project-based challenges, and student voice—it could become a tool for empowerment rather than compliance. The future of elementary education lies not in copying past models, but in building systems where every child, regardless of background, gains not just academic resilience, but the confidence to learn, question, and grow beyond the summer months.
