Their series “The Filter Bubble” (2020), examining algorithmic amplification of extremism, was widely cited in academic and policy circles, influencing debates on platform regulation in the EU and U.S. Geopolitically, their work reflected and shaped shifting centers of influence. While Western media often focused on Europe and North America, Milne and Young prioritized underreported regions—Southeast Asia, the Sahel, Latin America—not as exotic backdrops, but as central nodes in global systems of power and exploitation. This recalibration aligned with broader trends: the rise of Global South media hubs, such as India’s *The Wire* and Nigeria’s *Premium Times*, and a

growing recognition that truth is not monolithic. Their collaboration embodied a polycentric media order, where authority is distributed, verified, and collectively upheld. Critics, however, questioned scalability. Can small, mission-driven units rival the reach of legacy conglomerates? Milne and Young responded not with mimicry, but with hybridization: blending nonprofit rigor with for-profit innovation, such as open-source data tools licensed to local journalists. This “networked resilience” allowed them to maintain autonomy while expanding impact, a model now emulated by outlets like Thepillar and the International Consortium of Investigative Journalists (ICIJ). Looking ahead, the long-term implications of their partnership are profound. As artificial intelligence begins to automate aspects of reporting—from data scraping to initial analysis—the human element Milne and Young championed becomes even more vital. Their insistence on deep context, ethical sourcing, and audience trust offers a counterweight to algorithmic reductionism. Moreover, their model suggests a future where journalism is less about monolithic brands and more about interdependent ecosystems, capable of adapting to political shocks and technological upheaval. the Global Media Forum in Bonn, she framed their work as part of a broader “epistemic movement”—a global effort to reclaim truth as a shared public good. Young, reflecting on two decades of collaboration, noted: “We didn’t just report stories; we rebuilt infrastructure.
