She advocates for integrating primary sources—such as manuscripts from the Kano Emirate archives—into exam preparation, fostering direct exposure to historical scholarship.

Economically, experts foresee a convergence between Islamic Studies and digital innovation. With Nigeria's youth demographics and growing tech sector, JAMB is poised to incorporate digital literacy—requiring candidates to 'assess the ethical implications of AI in religious jurisprudence' or 'evaluate the role of online fatwa platforms in shaping public opinion.'
