China's education system offers a contrasting paradigm. Though Mandarin dominant, recent reforms emphasize *zhongguowen* (Chinese language) with nuanced noun instruction: students

distinguish *城市* (city, common) from *北京* (Beijing, proper), but also explore classical Chinese names like *Confucius*—bridging historical identity with modern literacy. This reflects a state-driven effort to balance national cohesion with cultural continuity, using worksheets as instruments of both compliance and heritage.
