From a geopolitical lens, **Adventure Time**'s global footprint also exposed cultural translation challenges. While Finn's outsider status resonated universally, localized interpretations varied. In Japan, his emotional restraint aligned with **mono no aware** aesthetics—appreciation of transient beauty—strengthening his symbolic weight.
