This was not just about building muscle; it was about restoring functional integrity. The timing was pivotal—coinciding with a global surge in sports medicine innovation, fueled by advances in wearable analytics, regenerative therapies, and a growing awareness of mental health's role in physical recovery.

Evolution: From Protocol to Philosophy
