Brazil’s recent reforms emphasize mental health screenings and elder safety protocols—responses to rising urban violence and corporate accountability demands. Despite these differences, converging pressures are reshaping the sector: digitalization, safety automation, and equity imperatives demand a new paradigm. The future license will likely incorporate dynamic credentials—updated in real time based on performance, safety records, and contextual adaptability.

Long-Term Implications and Strategic Foresight
