This created a feedback loop in which state media reinforced government claims, and government claims were amplified by media—forming a self-sustaining cycle of perception. Figures like economist Pedro Malan (later central bank president) were portrayed not as ideologues, but as rational stewards of national progress. By framing these as necessary technical adjustments, the regime deflected moral scrutiny, positioning critics as obstructionist to national development. This narrative strategy had global implications. Brazil’s model of “developmental authoritarianism” attracted attention from international financial institutions and emerging economies. Serrailier documented how Brazilian diplomats, advised by media strategists, promoted this approach in UN forums and Latin American summits, positioning the country as a bridge between Global North capital and Global South aspirations. Yet the fragility of this model became evident in 1982, when global interest rates spiked and commodity prices collapsed. The debt crisis shattered the illusion of stability, exposing the underlying vulnerability of an economy built on borrowed growth. Serrailier showed how the regime’s media apparatus initially resisted this reality, portraying crises as temporary setbacks rather than systemic failures. It was only when mass protests erupted—student movements, labor strikes, and regional uprisings—that official narratives began to fracture, revealing the deep social costs obscured by months of carefully managed messaging.

Expert Perspectives and Global Parallels

Serraillier's work resonated deeply with scholars and practitioners of authoritarian communication. Analysts at the Woodrow Wilson Center noted parallels with Eastern Bloc propaganda, particularly in the use of state media to construct "alternative realities" that aligned with regime interests. Yet unlike Soviet models, Brazil's approach was more adaptive—integrating technocratic credibility with media spectacle, allowing for limited public debate without
