Dr. Amara Nkosi, literary theorist at the University of Cape Town, argues that Grade 12 literature “functions as a linguistic scaffold for decolonizing thought.” She notes that when students engage with Achebe not as a footnote to **Heart of Darkness**, but as a foundational voice in their own education, they begin to see literature as a tool of epistemic resistance. Similarly, Professor Rajiv Mehta, director of the Centre for Critical Global Studies in Mumbai, warns against “canon fatigue”—the danger that rigid adherence to Western classics can mute local narratives. “Literature grade 12 must be a bridge,” he insists, “not a barrier.” His research on multilingual curricula in India demonstrates how integrating regional literatures with global texts fosters cognitive flexibility and intercultural empathy. Controversies surrounding the language of Grade 12 literature reveal deeper fractures in society. In Texas, recent debates over “diverse texts” have led to the deconstruction of works by authors like Langston Hughes and Maya Angelou from advanced English tracks, framed as “divisive” or “age-inappropriate.” This reflects a broader backlash against critical race theory and identity-based pedagogy, where literary analysis is recast as ideological indoctrination. Yet opposition is not absent. Grassroots

coalitions—such as the #TeachTheTruth network—argue that omitting texts rooted in Black, Indigenous, and queer experiences deprives students of the very tools to understand their own agency in an unjust world. The linguistic diversity required by inclusive curricula is not an erosion of rigor but an expansion of it. Risks abound in this evolving landscape. The pressure to standardize curriculum outcomes often undermines teacher autonomy and creative pedagogy. In Finland, where Grade 12 education remains globally lauded, the emphasis on teacher-led interpretation and student-led inquiry preserves the depth of literary engagement. Conversely, in systems where high-stakes testing dominates, literature risks becoming a perfunctory exercise in memorization rather than meaning-making. Moreover, digital literacy introduces new challenges: while online editions and AI-assisted analysis democratize access, they also threaten deep reading by encouraging skimming and fragmentation. Looking ahead, the long-term implications of Grade 12 literature’s linguistic trajectory are profound. As artificial intelligence begins to generate literary texts, the value of human-written, culturally embedded narratives intensifies. Grade 12 students will no longer read only to interpret metaphor and structure, but to interrogate authorship, authenticity, and authorship’s evolving forms. The language of literature will increasingly include digital vernaculars—memes, code-switched social media prose, algorithmic storytelling—demanding curricula that evolve faster than institutional inertia. Yet resilience persists. In Uruguay, where the national curriculum mandates monthly “literary salons” where students debate texts in public forums, Grade 12 literature thrives as a civic
