Within schools, implementation challenges reveal structural inequities. Schools in socioeconomically disadvantaged areas often lack specialist teachers, relying on generalist staff untrained in religious pedagogy. This creates a paradox: while the GCSE aims to democratize access to high-quality religious knowledge, disparities in teacher expertise risk reinforcing educational inequality. Furthermore, the pressure to “teach to the test” can incentivize shallow coverage, privileging memorization of key doctrines over deep engagement with interpretive complexity. France, shaped by *laïcité*, largely excludes religious instruction from state schools, relegating it to private or optional courses—a stark contrast to the UK's institutional embrace. EdExcel's GCSE occupies a middle ground: standardized, secular in design, yet deeply engaged with religious content as a lens for critical thought. Its emphasis on comparative analysis and global case studies distinguishes it from more doctrinal or locally confined approaches.
