Adopting widely supported features rather than proprietary extensions increases the likelihood that PDFs will remain usable across future platforms and devices.

Final thoughts on maximizing PDF potential

PDF files are more than simple digital pages—they are powerful containers for structured information. By applying effective navigation, organization, security, and accessibility practices, users can fully leverage Arizona State University Intelligence Studies in PDF format.
