Connie Denio, though less publicly visible, brought a complementary rigor, combining deep financial analysis with an unflinching eye on institutional power. Together, they forged a partnership that redefined investigative reporting in the energy sector, blending on-the-ground reporting with systemic critique. Their journey began in the Southwest, where Karlan first reported on the environmental and social costs of oil extraction in New Mexico and Texas—communities often reduced to footnotes in corporate and political discourse. Connie, with a background in economics and regulatory affairs, provided the analytical scaffolding that transformed anecdotal suffering into quantifiable inequity. Their early articles, published in regional

Looking ahead, the challenges they've illuminated are only intensifying. The energy transition is no longer linear; it is contested, geopolitically charged, and technologically fragmented. The rise of critical minerals, hydrogen economies, and carbon capture introduces new arenas for narrative control—where misinformation and strategic opacity threaten progress. The Denios' framework for tracking influence—spotlighting financial opacity, regulatory capture, and media framing—offers a vital toolkit for navigating this complexity. Their later work, including a 2023 book **Power's Edge: Narratives That Shape Energy**, synthesizes decades of insight, arguing that control over story equals control over future. They warn of a “narrative trap,” where entrenched interests use media to manufacture doubt around renewable technologies, while simultaneously leveraging green branding to maintain legitimacy. In interviews, Karlan and Connie have emphasized that journalism's role is not passive observation but active accountability—especially when markets and governments obscure truth. Their approach demands patience, precision, and persistence—qualities increasingly rare but indispensable. The Denio legacy endures not in awards or headlines, but in institutions transformed, policies recalibrated, and a generation of journalists trained to see energy not as a

commodity, but as a contested terrain of human values, power, and survival. In an era of climate urgency and information warfare, their work remains a benchmark for how truth can still shape history.
