Forensic pathologists involved in the case emphasized the critical role of photography in reconstructing timelines. Dr. Lila Chen, the lead medical examiner, noted in a post-mortem briefing that the sequence of injuries—consistent with defensive wounds followed by a fatal blow—aligned with the spatial distribution of bloodstains and trauma patterns captured in the images. This visual evidence, she stressed, provided objective corroboration of victim resistance, countering potential narratives of passive victimization.

Crime scene investigators echoed this. Mark Delgado, a forensic specialist with the Idaho State Bureau of Investigation, explained that photogrammetric models allowed for precise measurements of blood spatter angles, which helped determine the attacker's position and movement. "Photography isn't just about recording what's there," he said in an interview. "It's about preserving spatial relationships that can't be reliably

remembered or reconstructed later.” Psychologists analyzing secondary exposure highlighted both therapeutic and harmful effects.
