Environmentally, industrial animal farming accounts for approximately 14.5% of global greenhouse gas emissions—more than the entire transportation sector—with methane from enteric fermentation and nitrous oxide from synthetic fertilizers dominating the footprint. Land use is equally alarming: over 77% of global agricultural land is used for livestock, yet it supplies only 18% of calories, highlighting a profound inefficiency. Deforestation in the Amazon, Cerrado, and Congo Basin continues at alarming rates to clear pasture and grow feed crops like soy, undermining carbon sinks and biodiversity. The ecological footprint is compounded by water stress. Producing one kilogram of beef requires between 15,000 and 20,000 liters of water—enough to sustain a person for over a year—straining aquifers in drought-prone regions like California's

Central Valley and India's Punjab. These externalities are rarely internalized in market prices, shifting costs onto communities, healthcare systems, and future generations.

Expert Perspectives: Science, Ethics, and the Crisis of Legitimacy

Scientists, ethicists, and agricultural economists increasingly frame industrial animal farming not as a neutral practice, but as a systemic crisis. Dr. Alan D.
