The *purāṇam* tradition thrived through *kavittam* (poetic recitations) and *abhinetra* (theatrical enactments), supported by royal grants and merchant patronage. This created a self-sustaining ecosystem where religious texts fueled cultural economy—temple festivals, artisan guilds, and scholarly schools—all rooted in Purāṇic narrative frameworks.

The 18 major Purāṇas—grouped under Vaishnava (10), Shaiva (5), and mixed traditions (3)—are not static. Their Telugu interpretations evolved through regional exegesis: for example, the *Shiva Purāṇa* was reimagined in Telugu by 15th-century *alvars* and *nayanars*, emphasizing local sacred geographies like the Nallur Kambadhakare shrine. Similarly, the

***Garuda Purāṇa* gained localized relevance in Telugu death rituals, adapting cosmological doctrines to regional funerary customs and kinship structures.**

This evolution was neither linear nor monolithic. Colonial encounters in the 19th century disrupted traditional transmission. Missionary critiques dismissed Purāṇas as mythological superstition, while British administrative policies marginalized temple-based learning. Yet paradoxically, this crisis spurred a Telugu renaissance: scholars like Krishnasastri Parivar (17th c.) and later Tammi Ramalinga Reddy (19th c.) codified Purāṇic knowledge, translating and annotating texts in accessible Telugu, thereby preserving them for modernity.

Geopolitical and Economic Context:

Texts as Instruments of Power and Identity

The 18 major Purāṇas were never confined to temples or scriptoria; they were active agents in the geopolitics and economies of their times. The *Vishnu Purāṇa*, with its detailed descriptions of Vaikuntha and cosmic order, became a blueprint for urban planning in temple towns—its spatial cosmology influencing city layouts and market zones. Colonial rule disrupted these economic circuits. British land reforms and the suppression of traditional patronage systems eroded

temple economies. Yet, the Purāṇas persisted not as relics but as adaptive texts. In the 20th century, nationalist movements repurposed Purāṇic heroes—Rama, Krishna, Prahlada—as symbols of cultural resilience against colonial erasure. The *Ramayana* recitations during the independence movement, often infused with Purāṇic motifs, exemplified how mythic narratives became tools of political mobilization. Today, in post-liberalization India, the Purāṇas underpin a booming cultural economy. Telugu-language film and television adaptations of Purāṇic episodes—such as *Ram
