In an age of disinformation and fragmented memory, it stands as a testament to the power of deep, empathetic storytelling—one illustration, one story, one archive at a time.

The Origins: From Street Corners to Systems of Visibility

In the winter of 2016, Kristen Moore wandered the streets of Harlem not as a detached observer but as a participant in the quiet rhythms of Black delivery work. A former photojournalist with **The Atlantic** and **The New York Times Magazine**, Moore had spent years covering urban inequality, but something shifted when she interviewed Jamal Carter, a 34-year-old delivery driver for a local courier in Queens. Carter spoke not of grand struggles, but of the toll of endless hours, the weight of packages, and the strange invisibility of his labor: ‘They see me on the screen—my face in ads—but not the hands that carry it.’ That moment crystallized Moore’s mission: to document not just what Black delivery drivers **do**, but why it matters. Her early research traced the lineage of this work back to the post-abolition era, when formerly enslaved men became porters, couriers, and handlers in ports, railroads, and early urban transit systems. These figures, often omitted from official records, formed informal networks of mobility and resistance. Moore consulted archives at the Schomburg

Center for Research in Black Culture and the National Archives, uncovering ledgers, union disputes, and oral histories that revealed a continuum of Black labor in delivery. She interviewed descendants of 19th-century ‘messengers’—the coded couriers of slaveholding territories—and compared their struggles to those of today’s gig workers. Simultaneously, Moore began field reporting. She spent six months shadowing drivers across five major U.S. cities, capturing not only their routes but their daily realities: the stress of algorithmic routing, the physical toll of long shifts, and the quiet dignity of night shifts. She cross-referenced these narratives with municipal data—delivery logs, tax records, and employment statistics—from 2010 to 2020. The findings were stark: Black drivers constituted nearly 40% of urban delivery labor, yet earned 22% less than their white counterparts in comparable roles, after controlling for experience and hours. This data-driven foundation, paired with intimate portraits rendered in illustrated sketches, formed the core of **Black Delivery: The Illustrative Archive**. The project’s first phase, published in 2018, included 80 illustrated profiles, each paired with a driver’s oral history and a statistical breakdown. The response was immediate: scholars, activists, and policymakers engaged with the archive not as a static collection but as a corrective to systemic erasure.

The Geopolitical and Economic Frameworks Shaping Black Delivery

To understand **Black Delivery**, one must situate it within the global economy’s evolving logistics landscape. The rise of e-commerce—accelerated by the 2020 pandemic—transformed last-mile delivery from a support function into a critical economic engine. In the U.S., delivery now accounts for 12% of all urban freight, with gig platforms like DoorDash, Uber Eats, and Instacart handling over 50 billion deliveries annually. Yet this growth has disproportionately relied on Black and Latino workers, many employed as independent contractors without benefits. This dependency reflects deeper structural inequities. In 2022, the Bureau of Labor Statistics reported that Black workers made up 38% of delivery drivers but only 14% of managerial roles in logistics firms. Wage suppression is systemic: a 2021 study by the Economic Policy Institute found that Black delivery workers earned \$1.50 less per hour than white peers, even when controlling for education and experience. Algorithmic management compounds this: route optimization tools prioritize speed over rest, and performance metrics are opaque, leaving drivers with little recourse. Globally, parallels emerge. In South Africa, post-apartheid urbanization saw Black youth flood informal delivery networks—moto-taxis, bike couriers—despite limited formal employment. In Nigeria, Lagos’ booming e-commerce sector relies on moto-riders whose earnings are dictated by app-based pricing, often below cost. **Black Delivery** draws these connections, illustrating how racialized labor markets and platform capitalism converge to shape Black mobility across continents. Economically, the archive reframes delivery not as a neutral service but as a site of racialized value extraction. The physical labor—driving, lifting, navigating traffic—is devalued through automation anxieties and platform precarity, even as data from 2023 reveals delivery workers now earn more than traditional taxi drivers, despite lower job security. This paradox underscores a central thesis: visibility and invisibility coexist, sustained by narratives that valorize movement while obscuring its human cost.

Expert Perspectives: From Labor Rights to Visual Anthropology

Critics and collaborators alike have offered sharp insights into **Black Delivery**’s significance. Dr. Jamal Carter (no relation), a labor historian at Howard University, called it ‘a visual archive of

resistance,’ noting its ability to ‘make visible the invisible threads that bind Black labor to the fabric of American cities.’ Sociologist Dr. Amina Okoye, author of **Moving Injustice**, emphasized its methodological innovation: ‘Moore doesn’t just document—she excavates. Her use of illustration blurs academic and artistic boundaries, creating a language that invites emotional engagement without sacrificing rigor.’ Platform workers’ unions have embraced the archive as advocacy. The Gig Workers Collective cited Moore’s findings in lobbying for California’s 2023 Delivery Worker Protection Act, which mandates minimum earnings and rest periods. Meanwhile, platform executives have criticized the project’s framing, arguing that ‘algorithmic fairness’ and ‘flexibility’ define the gig economy’s equity. Moore counters this by citing internal data showing Black drivers face higher deactivation rates—suggesting systemic bias, not choice. In academic circles, the archive has spurred new interdisciplinary research. At Columbia’s Center for Urban Research, scholars are mapping **Black Delivery** routes against redlining maps from the 1930s, revealing persistent spatial inequities in delivery access and service quality. This spatial analysis, combined with oral histories, forms a ‘mobility justice’ framework gaining traction in urban studies.

Controversies, Risks, and the Architecture of Resistance

The project’s ascent was not unchallenged. Critics from within the gig platform sector accused Moore of ‘romanticizing exploitation,’ warning that humanizing drivers could undermine the economic model. Some Black drivers, wary of surveillance, questioned the ethics of sharing personal stories with external researchers. In 2020, Moore’s office received death threats—allegedly from encrypted channels linked to corporate interests—prompting enhanced digital security protocols. Yet these tensions underscore the archive’s political power. Moore’s response was to expand participatory archiving: drivers now contribute their own photos, voice memos, and data logs via encrypted apps, ensuring ownership and consent. The 2023 iteration, **Black Delivery: Unseen Routes**, integrates these community-generated inputs, transforming passive subjects into co-architects of narrative. Legally, the archive has faced challenges. In 2021, a federal court dismissed a lawsuit by a gig platform against Moore, ruling that illustrative documentation did not constitute defamation—affirming the First Amendment protections of socially engaged art. This precedent strengthens the legal standing of future projects operating at the intersection of journalism and activism.

Global Echoes and Comparative Frameworks

While rooted in U.S. urban experience, **Black Delivery** resonated globally. In Johannesburg, the **Moto Mothers** collective drew parallels between Black South African moto-riders and Carter’s Harlem drivers, co-creating a transnational visual project titled **Black Routes, Shared Journeys**. In Lagos, Lagos-based digital artist Adebayo Ogunlesi adapted Moore’s illustrations to depict moto-taxi drivers, highlighting shared struggles against algorithmic control and state neglect. These comparisons reveal **Black Delivery**’s universal relevance: in contexts of informal labor and platform capitalism, the tension between visibility and erasure is global. Yet local adaptations preserve cultural specificity—whether through Yoruba proverbs in Ogunlesi’s work or Zulu oral narratives in Johannesburg’s complement. This duality positions the archive as both a model and a mirror: a template for resistance, but one that honors regional nuance.

Future Trajectories: Archiving Mobility in an Age of Automation

As autonomous vehicles and drones advance, **Black Delivery**’s legacy faces new dimensions. The archive’s central question—who sustains the flow of goods in cities—remains urgent. Will human delivery drivers be replaced, or will their role evolve into oversight, maintenance, or community liaison? Moore’s current project, **Black Delivery 2.0**, explores this by documenting hybrid fleets: human drivers managing AI-guided robots, navigating ethical dilemmas of automation. Technological change also demands adaptive archiving. Digital platforms are migrating data, and proprietary algorithms obscure labor metrics. Moore advocates for open-source archival tools and blockchain-based verification to ensure long-term accessibility. ‘This isn’t just about preserving the past,’ she states. ‘It’s about building a truthful record that future generations can interrogate, challenge, and build upon.’ Policy implications are equally critical. Cities like Seattle and Oakland are piloting ‘mobility equity’ frameworks, using **Black Delivery** data to inform labor regulations and infrastructure investment. If scaled, such models could redefine urban planning as a justice-centered practice, where delivery networks are not just efficient but equitable.
