Geopolitical forces further accelerated this disintegration. The Cold War's end and the rise of neoliberalism redefined public life as privatized and market-driven. In cities like Detroit, Cleveland, and St. Louis, alley closures mirrored broader disinvestment—facilities shuttered not from lack of demand, but from shrinking margins. The result was a spatial fragmentation: communities no longer converged in shared spaces, but dispersed across digital platforms and private venues that demanded payment, exclusivity, or algorithmic engagement. Expert analysis reveals deeper psychological and sociological undercurrents. Sociologist Ray Oldenburg, in his seminal work **The Great Good Place** (1989), argued that “third places”—spaces between home and work where casual social exchange occurs—are the bedrock of community health.
