Anthropologist Margo Goodison’s work on Black Southern communities reveals how oral traditions and intergenerational storytelling preserved values of mutual aid and collective memory. This gap is not natural; it is the product of policy: from the 1930s Federal Housing Administration’s redlining to modern disparities in business lending and education funding. Wealth determines access to quality housing, healthcare, and

education—all critical to family stability. Without inherited assets or intergenerational transfers, Black families face greater vulnerability during crises, escalating the risk of conflict over limited resources. Urban centers like Chicago’s South Side or Baltimore’s west side exemplify this dynamic. These neighborhoods, shaped by decades of disinvestment, host families grappling with overcrowded housing, underperforming schools, and limited economic mobility. A 2022 Brookings study found that Black families in high-poverty urban areas are twice as likely to experience housing instability—a key trigger for familial strain. Meanwhile, suburbanization and white flight drained urban tax bases, leaving inner-city schools and services chronically underfunded. The result: a geography of stress where family cohesion is tested daily. Global parallels reveal both similarities and contrasts.
