The findings were explosive: foreign actors had embedded narratives in over 40% of high-stakes political campaigns in the region, often via seemingly organic grassroots movements. This work forced a reckoning in democratic institutions, prompting reforms in election monitoring and prompting ASEAN governments to commission their own media integrity audits. Expert Perspectives: The Think Tank and Policy Circles Sakamoto's insights were sought by governments, think tanks, and international bodies. In 2016, he advised Japan's Ministry of Internal Affairs on countering foreign disinformation, helping design public awareness campaigns that reduced
