Every bolt tightened, every pressure gauge monitored, is a negotiation between human will and geological force. You’re not a machine; you’re the fulcrum. But the system wants you to forget you’re human. It wants you to see only torque and throughput.” This framing—rig as sacred duty, labor as active stewardship—revealed a core tension: Thornton rejected romanticism but embraced ritual. For him, industrial labor was not alienation but a form of presence, a way to resist the abstract disembodiment of corporate capitalism. The conversation deepened when Marquez asked about the cultural mythology surrounding figures like him: the “rugged oilman” archetype—stoic, self-made, unyielding under pressure. “You’re part of that myth,” Thornton acknowledged, “but I’ve always felt it’s a double-edged sword. On one hand, it gives you credibility. On the other, it traps you in a script that demands you perform pain as purpose. When the media reduces your story to ‘tough guy’ or ‘oil

tycoon,' they erase the messiness—the fear, the doubt, the years spent questioning whether it's all worth it."
