By 2013, the franchise had grossed over \$400 million globally, according to industry reports, with graphic novels alone selling over 2 million copies. Yet, its impact extended beyond sales. *Highschool of the Dead* influenced a wave of post-apocalyptic media—*The Walking Dead*, *Snowpiercer*—by proving that adolescent protagonists could anchor complex, morally ambiguous narratives without sacrificing emotional authenticity. Expert Perspectives: From Literary Critique to Psychological Analysis
