The editorial team also understood the importance of visual storytelling. Artist Gene Colan, though known for earlier Marvel heroes, influenced the series' visual language through his emphasis on shadow and silhouette—techniques that mirrored Murdock's blindness and underscored themes of perception and truth. The use of stark contrasts, limited color palettes, and dynamic panel layouts created a visual rhythm that mirrored the tension between chaos and clarity. injustice with integrity. The series also reflected broader shifts in media economics. The rise of graphic novels as a distinct format—pioneered earlier by works like **Watchmen**—was gaining traction, driven by demand for sophisticated, collected storytelling. **Daredevil Vol. 1** capitalized on this trend, presenting a serialized arc that rewarded patience and investment, a model that would later be replicated across platforms.
