In China, state-led urbanization has enabled the rapid deployment of standardized, high-capacity storage complexes near new metro lines, ensuring seamless connectivity. In India, informal storage dominates due to fragmented land markets and delayed infrastructure, yet startups like Stash and Ula are digitizing access and introducing modular, scalable solutions tailored to local needs. Where space is abundant, storage proliferates as a convenience; where it is scarce, it evolves into a strategic infrastructure asset.
