Standing armies, equipped with firearms, replaced feudal levies, centralizing power under monarchies and states. The ability to maintain a professional, disciplined military required bureaucratic infrastructure—taxation systems, supply chains, and legal codes—fostering the very state institutions that enabled modern governance.
