The piano's global spread was inseparable from European imperialism. Industry Impact and the Rise of Music as Intellectual Property

The late 19th century saw the nascent formalization of music copyright, particularly in France and Germany, where legal frameworks began to protect composers' rights against unauthorized reproduction. Van Gogh's piano works, composed in an era before widespread copyright enforcement, exist in a legal limbo—neither fully protected nor freely available.
