This structural dependency complicated her sense of agency: she was both creator and captive of a system that commodified Black culture while denying its full authorship. The “colored me” she projected in her writing was thus layered with this ambivalence—pride in cultural ownership, yet awareness of the economic and symbolic hierarchies that shaped visibility. Her most iconic work, ‘Their Eyes Were Watching God’ (1937), is perhaps the most intimate articulation of this inner world.
