The monsoon system—predictable seasonal winds—enabled reliable seasonal voyages, turning what were once sporadic exchanges into structured trade corridors. By the 1st century CE, Roman and Han silk exports via maritime routes were documented in Chinese annals and Roman trade diaries, indicating a nascent transoceanic economy. Yet, this early phase lacked institutional continuity. Trade was opportunistic, driven by elite demand for luxury goods—silk, porcelain, and later spices—rather than systemic economic integration. The real transformation began with state consolidation. rudders, watertight bulkheads, and multiple masts—enabled larger, safer vessels capable of long-haul voyages. The Zhu Fan Zhi (Records of Foreign Peoples), compiled during the Song, documents over 200 ports and detailed trade goods: Chinese ceramics destined for the Swahili Coast, Southeast Asian spices exchanged for Indian textiles and Arabian incense. This period was not merely commercial but also cultural: Buddhist monks traveled by sea, transmitting texts and iconography from India to China; Persian astronomers taught at imperial courts; and Malay traders intermarried with coastal communities, creating hybrid identities that reshaped regional societies. Yet, the maritime Silk Road’s evolution was inseparable from geopolitical rivalries and economic imperatives. The rise of Srivijaya (7th–13th centuries) in Sumatra exemplifies how local

powers leveraged trade position—controlling the Strait of Malacca—to extract tolls, project influence, and become cultural intermediaries. Meanwhile, the Chola Empire in South India expanded its naval reach into Southeast Asia, using maritime trade as a tool of soft power. These regional actors transformed the Silk Road into a contested arena where economic interdependence coexisted with political competition. The Mongol Yuan Dynasty (1271–1368) briefly unified Eurasia under Pax Mongolica, integrating maritime routes into a broader overland-sea continuum. Kublai Khan’s maritime expeditions, including the ill-fated Java campaign, underscored the strategic importance of naval power. However, internal fragmentation and the collapse of centralized authority destabilized the system. The subsequent Ming Dynasty (1368–1644) initially

embraced maritime grandeur—Zheng He’s seven voyages (1405–1433) reached the Arabian Peninsula and East Africa, projecting Ming prestige through massive fleet deployments. Yet, a shift toward inward-focused agrarian policies and isolationist edicts abruptly curtailed state-led maritime expansion, creating a vacuum later filled by European powers.

Geopolitical and Economic Context: The Silk Road as a Global System (15th–19th Centuries)
