Ono, born in Tokyo in 1933, absorbed this symbolism firsthand. Her childhood, marked by displacement during wartime and exile in post-war Japan, embedded in her the visceral reality of loss, yet also the belief in healing through expression. By the early 1960s, as Ono collaborated with John Lennon in New York, the paper crane evolved beyond cultural artifact into a performative statement. In works like *Cut Piece*, a seminal 1964 performance where audience members cut her clothing, the crane motif—silent, folded, and vulnerable—became a ritual of surrender and empathy.
