These material traces validate *Beowulf*'s embeddedness in a historical reality where oral poetry served as both cultural memory and political propaganda. Yet the epic transcends mere chronicle; its characters embody archetypes—Beowulf as heroic outlier, Hrothgar as weary king, Grendel as existential threat—elevating individual myth to universal resonance. The transition from oral recitation to written text coincided with the Christianization of Scandinavia and the Anglo-Saxon world. Scribes, often monks trained in Latin and vernacular traditions, inscribed *Beowulf* on animal parchment—likely in monastic scriptoria—transforming a performative act into a fixed artifact. This transformation preserved not only language but ideological framing: pagan heroism filtered through Christian moral lenses, where fate (wyrd) coexists with divine providence. The manuscript's survival through centuries of political upheaval—Viking raids, monastic dissolution, Reformation iconoclasm—attests to its perceived cultural and spiritual value.

Evolution: From Manuscript to Modern Canon — The Text's Lifecycle

The textual history of *Beowulf* is a palimpsest of transmission, loss, and rediscovery. Only one of 11 surviving medieval manuscripts (Coimbra Codex, Nowell Codex, etc.) preserves the full poem; others are fragmentary or damaged, reflecting centuries of neglect and selective preservation. The Nowell Codex, burned in the 1731 Cotton Library fire, remains the most complete, yet its survival is a stroke of historical fortune.
