A single arrest photo can bar someone from housing, jobs, or education, creating a self-perpetuating cycle of disadvantage.' Conversely, civil rights advocate Jamal Carter, director of the North Carolina Justice Initiative, sees potential for reform. 'We must audit these archives. Count how many Black men appear, how often charges are low-level, how many records stem from policing in underserved areas. Transparency is key. If we treat mugshots not as inert records but as active instruments of power, we can demand accountability.' Legal scholars emphasize procedural risks. Professor Elena Ruiz of the University of North Carolina Law School notes: 'The proliferation of mugshots enables a form of anticipatory policing. If a system flags someone as high-risk based on past identifications—even minor ones—it constrains their future before any conviction. This undermines presumption of innocence—a cornerstone of the legal system.'
