Stadiums rise like monuments to ambition, often underutilized post-event—echoing broader concerns about “white elephant” projects in host nations. Yet for emerging economies, the round ball remains a path to visibility. Saudi Arabia's recent multibillion-dollar investments in European clubs and hosting rights signal a strategic pivot: using football to diversify away from oil, rebrand a global image, and assert regional influence.
